Lakemont Park Route

Peoples Natural Gas Field

Opened on April 15, 1999, Peoples Natural Gas Field is a 7,210-seat baseball-only stadium located in Altoona, Pennsylvania. It is the home ballpark of the Double-A Eastern League's Altoona Curve Minor League Baseball team and is considered by fans, players, baseball executives, and the media as one of the finest minor league baseball facilities in America. The ballpark features a beautiful brick exterior and the design is modeled after a railroad roundhouse to tie in the industry, which helped found the city of Altoona. The "Skyliner" roller coaster from neighboring Lakemont Park and the scenic Allegheny Mountains add to the overall beauty of Peoples Natural Gas Field.

Skyliner Roller Coaster

The Skyliner Roller Coaster is a wooden roller coaster located at Lakemont Park in Altoona, Pennsylvania. It first opened in 1960 at New York's Roseland Park, and was John C. Allen's first full-size coaster design. The Skyliner operates a single train with room for up to 18 adults. The Skyliner was relocated to Lakemont Park in 1987.

Leap the Dips Roller Coaster

Lakemont Park, located in Altoona, Pennsylvania, houses the world's oldest-surviving roller coaster, the Leap-The-Dips built in 1902. On June 19, 1996, the roller coaster was added to the list of National Historic Landmarks by the National Park Service.

The Casino at Lakemont Park

Originally called the Pavilion, the Casino has evolved over the years through a rich heritage of theater, dances and social functions. Established circa 1890, the Casino has retained its historic beauty while growing to become a state of the art banquet facility. The setting overlooking Lakemont Reservoir is breathtaking. The Casino hosts small business meetings, intimate special occasions, wedding receptions, large or small banquets and seminars, trade shows, conferences, and gala celebrations.
